



Bin Regulations

Items that can go into the bin:

- 1) Construction Debris/
Renovation Material
Carpet
Metal
Brush/Trees
Cardboard
- 2) Household Junk
Bagged Household Garbage
Misc. Junk & Furniture

Any combination of (1) & (2) is subject to an additional \$25 charge.
Cardboard must be placed on the top of the load and may not contain material inside.
Please separate household and renovation debris. Household on bottom, construction on top.

Items that cannot go into the bin:

- Paint Cans
- Electronics
- Tires
- Recyclables
- Paper
- Asbestos/Vermiculite/Lead Paint/Freon
- Food Waste
- Liquids of any kind
- Propane Tanks
- Other Hazardous Materials

These items can be set beside the bin & taken for an additional charge.
Paper must be in blue bags. Hard cover books must have hard cover removed.

Large quantities of the following heavy items can be loaded into the bin, but are subject to additional fees:

- Rock
- Concrete
- Ceramic Tile
- Asphalt
- Soil/Sod
- Brick
- Plaster
- Wet Wood
- Drywall
- Roofing Shingles - May only contain asphalt shingles, nails and tarpaper.

These materials may only be loaded to a maximum height of 15" from the bottom of the bin.
Please notify us before loading these materials.

- Wrappings from new shingles can be bagged and placed on top of the load.

Please note:

- **Payment due upon receipt of invoice.**
- Due to legal restrictions, debris may not be piled higher than the sides of the bin.
- Drop off service is for up to 5 days. Each day after is charged at \$15/day.
- Please call to schedule your pick up 24 hours in advance.
- Customer is responsible for all debris in the bin. Any non-compliant material will be returned or subject to additional charges.
- Bins must be loaded by hand. No heavy machinery like excavators or skid steers that can damage the bin.
